Friends of Brockwell Park – Constitutional Change

Proposed by Keith Fitchett (FoBP Treasurer) and Laura Morland (elected Committee member and FoBP tree advisor)

We are in the fortunate position of having more members prepared to serve on the Executive Committee than are allowed under the current constitution. We are therefore proposing small limited changes to allow the maximum size of the Committee to increase from sixteen to nineteen. For the sake of simplicity the changes are presented in three resolutions below but the AGM may prefer to have a single vote on all three:

There is at the moment no provision for filling a vacancy among the Committee members elected at the AGM – these vacancies, either from resignations or otherwise, will affect the number of possible co-options to the Committee because of the one-third provision in clause G2 above. We therefore propose a new clause G3. If adopted current clauses 3, 4, 5, and 6 will be re-numbered 4, 5, 6, and 7 respectively.

RESOLUTION 3

Proposed new clause G3

If a vacancy arises among the officers or elected Committee members the Committee may fill the vacancy either from existing Committee members or from the membership of the Friends. The appointment of a member who is not already on the Committee must have at least ten days' notice.
